What is a Lions Project?

To meet the criteria for a "Lions project" for a regular grant, certain factors are typically present. The Foundation does not require that <u>all</u> of the criteria below are present, but the overall project description must convince Foundation board of directors that it is a "Lions project".

- 1. If the project has a name, is the word Lions included? For example, Lions Park, Lions Youth Baseball League, North Dakota Lions Clubs float, Lions Trees for the Future.
- 2. Does the community recognize this activity as a Lions project?
- 3. If the project involves a physical structure, is the name of the sponsoring Lions Club or a Lions Clubs International logo permanent affixed to the structure?
- 4. Does the project have a history of Lions member involvement? For example, how many years have Lions worked on this project? What percentage of members will participate in the project?
- 5. What will the sponsoring Lions club specifically contribute to the project? For example, hours of labor and funding (not including Foundation grants).
- 6. What Lion members are directly involved in planning and executing the project?
- 7. Is there more than one Lions Club involved in the project?

Regular Lions Foundation of North Dakota grants are <u>not</u> intended to provide funds which would allow local Lions Clubs to "chip in" or "contribute" to projects led, sponsored, or organized by other entities. Those other entities could include-but are not limited to--a city, a chamber of commerce, a community development organization, a church, a business, or a non-Lions club.
