I started in Fargo, by loading up 22 cases of Dad's root beer into my van after making arrangements ahead of time with various Lions clubs to drop off cases before or on the date set for Father's Day.

Napoleon launched an effective ad in their local newspaper: "Drive-Thru Father's Day. Napoleon Lions will be handing out Dad's root beer to Dad's and their children on June 20th. Just drive up, no need to get out of your car. From 11am til gone". Sec. Lorraine Piatz's home address was displayed. Later in the day, she told me how 5 children knocked on her door to ask if there were any bottles left. Imagine the joyful look on their faces when Lion Lorraine had exactly 6 root beers to give to their Dad and themselves! (Thank you, Sec. Lorraine for being part of the brainstorm in creating Project Dad with me.)

Also, posters were placed around Medina promoting that on June 21st, The Cafe in town would pass out a free Dad's to all the fathers and their children during their meal inside as a gift from the Medina Lions. President Clyde Reister helped me with this service project and stated the Cafe was buzzing as it served over 150 bottles, at a safe-distance, to families.

A large display of Dad's root beer for Father's Day was promoted by Super Valu manager and Ashley Lions secretary, Kirk Rueb, as a gift from Ashley Lions for each Dad who "pops" into the store for a free bottle.

On June 20th, Hazelton held a parade/community picnic. By the count of bottle caps served by Treasurer Dean and myself, there were unexpected smiles on 75 Dad's faces as they received a gift of Dad's root beer from the Hazelton Lions Club.

President Mark Schmidt told me the following week how the Community Leaders expressed their appreciation for the Lions service project.

Meanwhile, in Linton, "The Grill" owner, Lion Mark Heidrich, authorized almost 50 Dad's bottles to be freely given to Dads along with their orders for inside dining.

Did you know Gackle has reopened a dine-in/take out place called The Freeze? On Father's Day, Lions Club Secretary, Rory Metz, and I handed out a free Dad's to over 40 dads inside, with the blessing of the new owner, Estee Nenow. We even made a few root beer floats with ice cream purchased at The Freeze by fathers and their family.

Later, still wearing my blue MD5 Lions vest, it was back on the road to hand out bottles of Dad's to Dads in Braddock, Kulm, Streeter, and Lehr. Earlier a few bottles had been handed over to Edgeley Lions Treasurer, Diane Greiman, to distribute. A few days later, I handed out the remaining bottles of Dad's to various Lions in Zeeland at their community picnic. Project Dad was a fun service accomplished by hauling over 500 bottles to be given out safely in making Father's Day more important during this time of crisis. Afterall, isn't our motto: WE SERVE?

District 5NW LCIF Coordinator, Mark Koller and District 5NE LCIF Coordinator, Rick Swenson are happy to announce the launching of a Campaign 100 raffle fundraiser for both district 5NW and District 5NE! We have great prizes from our Scheels store in Bismarck and Fargo. Everything from *Fishing rods to Men's and Women's Mountain Bikes*. 15 items totaling \$5900 in value! The prizes range from \$300 to \$550. Each Lions district will be doing their own Campaign 100 fundraiser. These fundraisers will start the week of August 2nd and both districts will be drawing their own district's prizes on Saturday October 17, 2020.

We need to finish strong again this year with fundraising for Campaign 100, so we are asking all of our clubs and our Lion members to support this fundraising raffle.

Here is the way our raffle will work:

- 1) The LCIF District Coordinator will email and contact each Lions club with the details of the raffle.






