The Enderlin Lions Club provides volunteers for "Meals on Wheels". Every Tuesday a Lion uses his or her own vehicle and their time. They ensure hot meals are delivered on a reliable basis to shut ins. Usually some 15 meals are dropped off on a 3-mile route and the chore takes around an hour. The volunteers receive neither compensation or mileage. It is a community service and the Lions Club is proud to be involved.

But there is a growing bug in the stew. Global warming, AKA climate change, is ruining the land. Based on infallible science, the Great North polar bear, fleeing disappearing ice floes and with no seals to eat, will be marching into Ransom County, North Dakota by June 4 of this year. Two month later, August 3 to be exact, Enderlin will be under 8 feet of melted polar cap. Yes, it is doom and gloom. Fossil fueled vehicles and machinery are to blame. They dump carbon dioxide into the atmosphere and this insulating blanket circling the globe raises the average temperature by 7 degrees every 16 days. Two choices: One, add another

hour by using the highway 46 overpass. The overpass does not have a pedestrian lane and is dangerous. The second choice is for the team to pack a sleeping bag, tent, Coleman stove, food and coffee and a tie-out rope and picket pin. With this gear they can comfortably camp by the parked train until a considerate CP train crew (and is there any other type of train crew?) can follow the law and move the train. Regardless the choice, a necessary precaution is including a high powered rifle for the roving polar bears looking for lunch courtesy of Boo-

Boo the cat or Olaf the dog. All of this is a small price to pay to remain in the soothing bosom of Mother Earth.

This green delivery service's motto is "H'EARS Hot Food" and the mules are cutting edge carbon neutral locomotion. The mules are generously provided by Lions Mike Martin and Susan Dopp and they are stabled west of Enderlin. Mules, a primitive but reliable source of power, are now the solution for tomorrow's nightmare.

• Phase 1- a donor has stepped up to provide the cement and the labor for the high jump and the long jump area. His partnership with the community and the Lions club is set to save over \$30,000 in costs. Goal met/ plan is set for May 2023.

• Phase 2- a professional track company will reclaim the old asphalt and lay new foundation. Cost over \$230,000. Already, pledges have been made to the Lions club for these costs. Goal met.

• Phase 3- Synthetic poly mat for 5K racing track/ rubberized and markings. Goal




