



Partners in Service make Horace Lions history and create a living legacy

Lions clubs are often called the heart of their communities. In Horace, the Lions Club is always active with everyone from school-age to senior citizens. That is one of the things that attracted Sarah and Arlin Fisher to the club.

They moved to Horace in 2002 and noticed all the contributions the club makes. Arlin, who worked for more than 27 years with Microsoft, is now a realtor. Sarah, who has been in healthcare for 34 years, is a CNA at Sanford Hospital, and had owned and managed Bolton Mobile Signs. They raised eight children together, adding two sons-in-law and three grandchildren.

Now they serve the Horace Lions Club, making history as co-presidents. The club adapts, they say, when the community faces challenges.

It was a personal and heart-breaking happening that brought the club's heart to the Fishers. In late June 2018, Sarah was watching the news when there was a report of a fatal car crash near Fargo. Two hours later someone from the trauma center at Sanford Hospital, where she works, called. Her son, Cameron, was in that accident. He was declared brain dead. His heart had been restarted at the accident scene. Cameron died July 2.

Through donation, he saved five lives the day he died. The boy who loved farming and machines, his family and fun, became an organ and tissue

donor and an inspiration. He benefitted 102 individuals. The oldest recipient was 83. Transplants took place in 21 states, including North Dakota, as well as one patient in Great Britain. Cameron's cornea donation was through Dakota Lions Sight and Health.

The Horace Lions Club became like family, Sarah said. When Sarah and Arlin sought ways to further donations, to increase awareness and offer comfort to others, the club was front and center. "What can we do?"

In 2018, the Fishers started Crosses for Cameron, a non-profit. Crosses for Cameron provides education, support and hope via organ donation activities and improves the community's physical and mental health through the Garden of Healing, their second non-profit.

The Garden, begun in 2020, is designed to offer a beautiful, peaceful retreat where people can go to reflect and remember. It is located in the Urban

Plains Park in south Fargo, between Sanford and Essentia Hospitals.

The Garden of Healing also has a Facebook page and YouTube video that gives further information about its development. This year phase two begins. A professional landscaping company designed the project.

The Horace Lions were the first club to make a major donation toward the Garden. Gateway Lions Club in Fargo, the Enderlin Lions Club and West Fargo Lions Club all have or will have markers with their names in the Garden.

Sarah and volunteers also paint rocks with Cameron's picture and Donate Life stickers, along with donation information, that are in bags. The bags are distributed at events and spread around the region and country. Sarah regularly gets pictures back from people who find the bags and post them on the Crosses for Cameron Facebook page.

Registering as an organ donor is quick and easy. Because of Cameron's donated organs, Sarah listened to her son's heart that lives on in an Iowa recipient.

Lions have big hearts. We show it through our service.

A number of the Fargo Gateway Lions started a non profit organization called Furniture Mission of the RRV in 2020. Since then they have served over 1,300 families in crisis with over 15,000 pieces of “gently used” furniture in the greater Fargo Moorhead area. In May the Barnesville, Minnesota Lions of MD5M, suggested doing a spring furniture “clean up” project in their town for FM. The attached picture shows members of their club

maybe send them a monetary gift to help them build up their administration account! WELCOME TO THE DISTRICT 5NW FAMILY!



MD5 Convention!

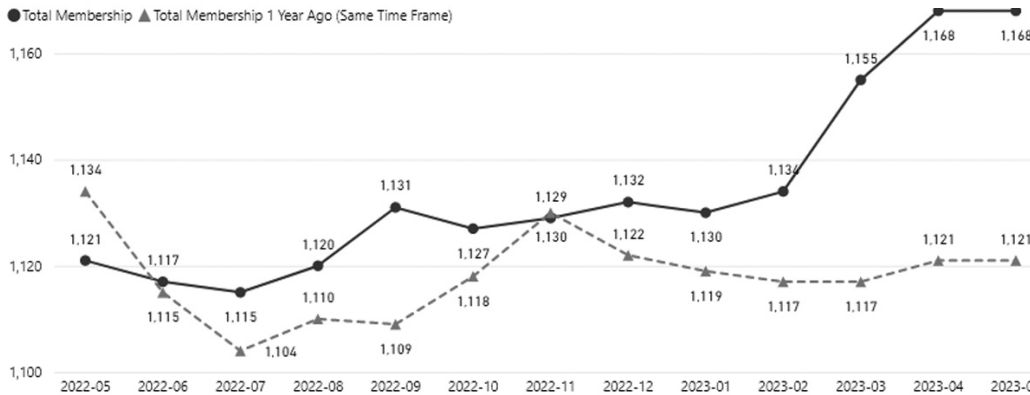
