

New Voices Roar in Spearfish

Being the sponsor of the coffee break at the MD5 convention in Spearfish, S.D. on May 26th, was an excellent time to invite Lions to attend the two New Voices break-out sessions. Why? Because even after four years of promoting and implementing New Voices throughout all 6 of our districts, there was still questions being asked about this LCI Initiative.

Session One - Introduction

Canada New Voices Global Chair, PDG Nicole Le Page, presented information about how this LCI Initiative got started and by whom. Did you know that 10 years ago, Lion Gudrun Yngvadottir organized a group of Lions from Iceland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, and Finland to focus on increasing female membership in Lions and promoting more women into leadership roles? By 2017, Vice-President Gudrun was on the path to becoming the first female International President of our global organization. When the LCI Board of Directors asked how she planned to bring in more

women members, she had a tested solution. In 2018, as International President, her plan was ready to be implemented to inspire more women to join Lions to serve for humanitarian causes. Since then, there have been steady increases worldwide. Today, there are 1 million male members and 425,000 female members in our Lions organization. In 2019, New Voices also expanded to include young men, and specialty club members who excel in service, membership, leadership, and marketing.

Session Two - The Impact

Prior recipients shared the impact of being a New Voices Nominee during the past four years.

Lion Karen daSilva shared that she had volunteered in many non-profit organizations, yet feeling negative because of ego conflicts and money issues which took away from the good being done. For three years, Lion Bruce Hagen kept asking her to visit the Bismarck Lions Club, which she did and also joined as a member in their positive atmosphere. In 2019, she was club president and then became service chair. The USA/Canada Forum in Des Moines inspired her to seek leadership training. After being nominated in 2021 for New Voices excellence in Service, she gained more confidence. Lion Karen is now 5NW 2nd Vice District Governor Elect.

DG Jeanette Bean of

the Bismarck Lions Club shared her experience as a New Voice. She grew up in a small town where she excelled in helping people for 17 years. She found her skills were appreciated as a Lion. After excelling as club president and zone chair, she was nominated for Leadership. She gained confidence and stepped up the ladder, now serving as the current 5NW District Governor and soon-to-be MD5 Council Chair. Thanks to all who attended the New Voices sessions in Spearfish. Together we strive to serve and together we will succeed in helping others across North Dakota, South Dakota, and Saskatchewan.

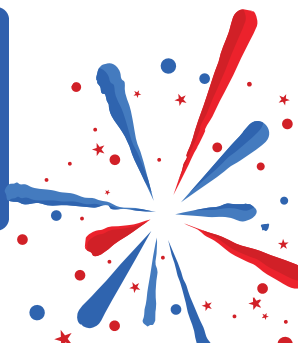

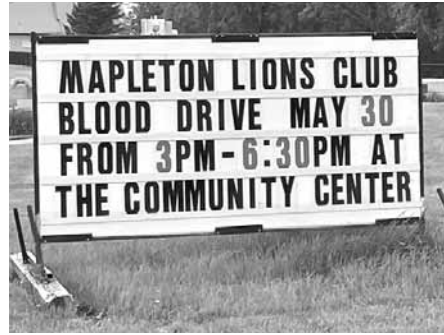
