Although she has experienced her struggles, the bright, beautiful, teenager shines with positivity and resilience! The second speaker was Lion Devin Melvie from the Bismarck, ND Lions Club. He is a successful, 30-year-old businessman from the Bismarck area that was diagnosed with Type I Diabetes twelve years ago. His inspirational words



spoke volumes to the attentive crowd. Next up to speak was Nikki Sturm-St. John. She was able to share encouraging words along with her enlightening retelling of Bret Michaels life story as a Type I Diabetic and long-time advocate for Diabetes Awareness and advancements in treatments. Then, what better way to inspire everyone to start walking than by having them watch a short video of Bret

Michaels himself, expressing words of encouragement! It was also announced that Bret Michaels was going to generously MATCH the funds raised from the event!!! He also paid the entire cost for a young South Heart student to attend the Diabetes Camp this summer! Corbin Haugen, age 8, was elated when finding out he will get to go to camp!

also included a presentation of prizes to the top 3 teams that raised the most amount of funds.





We will be having our first cabinet meeting Saturday, August 5th at 10:AM at Or-lady Hall Jamestown College. Please plan to attend.



- Serves as a club resource on current community needs by monitoring the service activities of other service clubs, developing community partnerships to expand service, and utilizing tools and resources offered by Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation.
- Increases member satisfaction by encouraging participation and engagement in service projects.
- Collaborates with the club membership chairperson and other club committees to promote membership opportunities to non-Lions during service projects.
- Attends the district governor's advisory committee meeting of the zone in which this club is located when appropriate.

Measuring Success
