#### LIONS PORTAL AIDS

In making my club visitations I am hearing about the great things that are happening within the District, but I am also hearing about the frustration that club secretaries, club administrators and officers are having in navigating the Lions Portal to update information and to make reports.

Lions International has now published step by step tutorials about reporting new members, club officers and most other specific topics that club secretaries and administrators will encounter. These guides include photos of the portal pages with directions and pictures of what exactly to click on. They can be found by searching "Lions Portal Updates" on your search engine. On the Portal Update website scroll down to "Learn with Training" and in the section "Quick Guides" you can select what you wish to do. A direct link is https://www. lionsclubs.org/en/resourcesfor-members/digital-products/portal-updates.

There are a number of other helps out there to guide you through the reporting process. There are training videos available on YouTube and a personal resource is our District Administrator Kristi Swenson who can be contacted at kristi.swenson0155@gmail.com.

Here are a few step by step guides, but if you are still encountering problems I encourage you to seek out the quick guides I referenced above which contain pictures:

#### **Updating Club Officers**

- · Login to the Lion Portal
- Select My Club
- •Under Member Actions on the right hand side select the blue Manage Club Officers box
- Select Create New Assignment and then click Next
  - Select Current or Upcom-

ing Lion Year and then click Next

- For Officer Type select Officer
- Note Select Administrator type to assign a Club Administrator
- For Title type select Official and then click Next
- Select an active member to assign the title to and click Next to complete the assignment
- If the Title type is not shown under Officer Type then you are probably selecting a Local Title so select Local and follow the same procedure

#### **Adding Members**

- Login to the Lion Portal
- Select My Club
- Under Member Actions on the right-hand side select Manage Club members
- Select Add, Edit, Transfer or Delete a New Member, then click Next
- Enter the First Name, Last Name, Date of Birth and Gender, then select Search. That will tell you if the information is being duplicated, possibly from a previous member
- Enter the rest of the Contact Information then click Next
- If adding a new member select the start date. Remember that the date selected must be within 3 months (the past two months plus the current month)
- Search for the member sponsor by name or by Lion ID if you have it
- Select the sponsor from the search and click Next
- Click Next to confirm the sponsor then the new member has been added

#### **Reporting Service**

- Log in to the Lion Portal
- Select My Club
- At the very top in the

dark Lions Portal Heading Click Service, then My Activities

- Click the Blue box at the top Create Service Activity
- Select the Box for your club and Click Next
- Enter a Title for the Service Activity and select the service type. Then click Next
- Near the top on the right side there is an edit box which will allow you to enter details. In the alternative you can click on the pencil icons to enter for each line.
- Enter all of the required fields
- Select the Report Complete check box if you are reporting an activity. If it is a Future Activity leave the check box empty
- Click Save and the service is reported

If you wish to access information about your club members it is found under My Club, then look for a row of options below the club name. Click on Data Export. That



will bring you to 4 options. Select what you want and the information will come up on the screen. It is easier to navigate if you then click on Field Editing Enabled and then Export. That will provide you with an Excel spreadsheet that you can organize as you desire and print.

Please make sure that all of your club's new members are promptly reported so that we can show the true progress toward achieving Mission 1.5 and please make sure to update your Service Activities. I have heard from several clubs that they have nothing to report. Remember that even Club Meetings should be reported. Lets get service reporting from 100% of our clubs this year.

#### **LCIF Disaster Relief Support Update for the United States**

Lions and Leos are the first to respond following natural disasters in communities across the globe. When communities need support, we provide solutions.

LCIF has provided an update following the impact of hurricanes in southeastern United States. LCIF has awarded 13 grants totaling \$365,000 for US hurricane relief so far and more are anticipated. 11 Emergency grants totaling \$165,000 for hurricane relief across Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Tennessee has been awarded. LCIF continues to work with Lions in additional districts and anticipate additional grant funding will be awarded. In addition to these 11 Emergency grants, LCIF has also awarded 2 Major Catastrophe grants. Multiple District 35 (Florida) and Multiple District 31 (North Carolina) were each awarded Major Catastrophe grants for \$100,000. Donations to the "General Disaster Fund" help LCIF award these grants immediately to Lions who are impacted by natural disasters. LCIF anticipates to grant support for Lions who continue hurricane relief activities. Thank you to the Lions Clubs and individuals who have donated.

Wherever there is a need, there is a Lion or Leo empowered by LCIF. 100% of your donation is used for others in need. Our global foundation enables us to expand our humanitarian service, respond quickly when necessary, and develop innovative projects with lasting impact.
